IHP Dues: In order for an individual to be eligible to participate as a rider, driver, vaulter, or longeur, in international competition as defined herein, said individual must be a member of the Federation and must pay an International High Performance "IHP" Discipline Due established annually by the Federation. Life Members are exempt from payment of the International High Performance Due. A Dressage rider may compete in one FEI Recognized Dressage Competition annually for an IHP Discipline fee of \$50.

FEI Registration: The fee for an FEI Registration number is \$15 per horse and \$15 per rider. This FEI fee is in addition to any applicable membership, horse recording and International High Performance dues. All horses, riders, drivers and vaulters competing in any and all FEI competitions, regardless of the star level or location of the competition are required to have this FEI Registration. Even if the horse has an FEI passport, it must also have an annual FEI Registration number. The FEI Registration is MANDATORY, effective January 1, 2006.

NEW THIS YEAR - FEI PONY CLASSES as part of the CDI 3*: A rider may compete as a Pony competitor from the beginning of the calendar year in which he reaches the age of 12 until the end of the year in which he reaches the age of 16. A pony is a small horse whose height at the withers, having been measured on a smooth level surface, does not exceed 148 cm without shoes or 149 cm with shoes. The Veterinary Regulations of the FEI apply to ponies and should be referred to for all veterinary matters including vaccinations, identification and medication control. Ponies are required to have a passport and an FEI Official Measurement Certificate.

Welfare of the Horse

FEI CODE OF CONDUCT

The Federation Equestre Internationale (FEI) expects all those involved in international equestrian sport to adhere to the FEI's Code of Conduct and to acknowledge and accept that at all times the welfare of the horse must be paramount and must never be subordinated to competitive or commercial influences.

1. At all stages during the preparation and training of competition horses, welfare must take precedence over all other demands. This includes good horse management, training methods, farriery and tack, and transportation.
2. Horses and competitors must be fit, competent and in good health before they are allowed to compete. This encompasses medication use, surgical procedures that threaten welfare or safety, pregnancy in mares and the misuse of aids.
3. Events must not prejudice horse welfare. This involves paying careful attention to the competition areas, ground surfaces, weather conditions, stabling, site safety and fitness of the horse for onward travel after the event.
4. Every effort must be made to ensure that horses receive proper attention after they have competed and that they are treated humanely when their competition careers are over. This covers proper veterinary care, competition injuries, euthanasia and retirement.
5. The FEI urges all involved with the sport to attain the highest levels of education in their areas of expertise.

CDI 3*/P Competitors - how to participate in Open Show

Horses entered in the CDI 3* may compete in the open show prior to the FEI Veterinary Inspection ("Jog"). They may also compete in the open show after the CDI 3* is completed.

Exhibitors of CDI 3* horses that are shown on Thursday in the Festival show, must be aware that the FEI veterinary inspection takes place in two sections: 1) In-stall inspections of horse and paperwork will begin at approximately 1:00pm; 2) The "Jog" is planned for 5:00pm. The in-stall inspection team will work around the schedule of CDI 3* horses and riders entered in Thursday classes. CDI 3* horses may be presented by a groom or other responsible individual. The horse's passport is required for both inspections.

All Competitors - If applicable, add the following to the class number: A/A (Adult Amateur), JR/YR (Junior/Young Rider), O (Open). Classes will be divided into A/A, JR/YR, O when there are three entries in the sub-division. Entries submitted with no designation will be entered as Open and change/post entry fees will apply if the entry is later changed to A/A.

Tentative Class Schedule - Any class may be scheduled at any time on the day entered. Freestyles require the use of the Main Arena and therefore are at the mercy of the CDI 3* draws Friday, Saturday, and Sunday. All class times are subject to revision due to the CDI 3* draws.

The Rules for Dressage Events (22nd edition, effective 1st January 2006), and if applicable the Rules for the World Cup Dressage Events and all subsequent published revisions, the provisions of which will take precedence.

An arbitration procedure is provided for in the FEI Statutes and General Regulations referred to above. In accordance with this procedure, any appeal against a decision rendered by the FEI or its official bodies is to be settled exclusively by the Court of Arbitration for Sport(CAS) in Lausanne, Switzerland.

1. INVITATIONS(Art.107-110,120.420.2-4, 423,448,1150,2150) The following foreign federations have been invited to attend: AUS, BEL, CAN, DEN, FRA, GER, GBR, MEX, NED, SWE. One groom will be allowed per rider.

2. EVENT'S ORGANISATION-(Art.114–115) - In exceptional circumstances, together with the approval of the Ground Jury the OC reserves the right to modify the schedule in order to clarify any matters or matters arising from an omission or due to unforeseen circumstances. Any such changes must be notified to all competitors and officials as soon as possible and they must be reported to the Sec. Gen. by the Foreign Judge.

3. CONDITIONS OF PARTICIPATION (Art. 422) - International events are open to competitors from the year in which they reach their 16th birthday. Competitors must be U.S. citizens who are members of the USA Equestrian or foreign citizens who are “competitors living abroad” in the U.S. and who have permission to enter from their own national federation (Art. 123, 134). Foreign citizens who are nominated by an invited foreign national federation and who have or will reach their 16th birthday in 2005 may also participate. **Horses** of any origin may take part in one competition per day provided they are aged 7 years and over (8 years for Grand Prix, GPS and GP Freestyle), the age being counted from 1st January of the year of birth, and have a height at the withers exceeding 149 cm including shoes, with the following restrictions: On no account, and under penalty of disqualification, may any horse take part in a CDI 3* and upwards which has been schooled by anyone other than the competitor concerned, in or outside the town where the event takes place, during the four days preceding the first competition of this event as well as for the duration of the whole event. Upon arrival on the showground, only the rider when riding, walking, leading or lungeing a horse (lunge whip allowed), is allowed to carry a whip (maximum 110 cm)) anywhere on the showground. The groom may also walk, lead and lunge a horse as above. Other parties are allowed to carry a whip, provided it is not in connection with the training of the horse.

4. INSURANCE: Competitors are responsible for all insurance for themselves, employees, owners and horses, etc. All owners and competitors are personally responsible for damages to third parties caused by themselves, their employees, their agents or their horses. They are therefore strongly advised to take out third-party insurance providing full coverage for participation in equestrian events at home and abroad, and to keep the policy up to date. All participants (which include, without limitation, the owner, lessee, trainer, manager, agent, coach, driver, rider, handler and the horse), for themselves, their principals, representatives, employees and agents shall agree that they participate voluntarily in the competition fully aware that horse sports and the competition involve inherent dangerous risk of serious injury or death, and by participating, they expressly assume any and all risks of injury or loss, and they agree to indemnify and hold the USEF, the Organising Committee, its officials and volunteers and the host facility, at the competition and their officials, directors, employees and agents harmless from and against all claims including for any injury or loss resulted, directly or indirectly, from the negligent acts or omissions of said officials, directors, employees or agents of the USEF or Competition.

5. DRAW FOR THE ORDER OF STARTING (Art 425) ; An ordinary draw will be conducted with the following exceptions: for the Freestyle tests and the Grand Prix Special, there will be a draw in groups of five for the order of starting. A draw first within the group of riders placed 11th to 15th and then within the group of riders placed 6th to 10th and last the group of riders placed 1st to 5th, e.e. the five best rider/horse combinations will start last. For the Intermediaire I Freestyle, if the qualification is made both from Prix St. Georges and Intermediaire I, the rider/horse combinations qualified from Prix St. Georges shall be drawn before riders qualified from the Intermediaire I, in groups of five.

6. ENTRY RIGHT TO SHOWGROUNDS (Art. 133,1005) - Competitors may arrive when stabling is opened, Tuesday, July 4, 2006 at noon or earlier by special arrangement. Only properly identified riders, grooms, farriers, treating vets, officials, organizing committee members and two owners per horse will be allowed to enter the stable area. The OC requires identification badges for identification and entry into stable area. All individuals will be asked to sign in and sign out of the stable area.

7. STABLING: Stabling (10 x 10 box stalls with doors) is available Tuesday, July 4, 2006, starting at noon. Earlier by special arrangement and at an extra charge of \$30 per night (subject to change). \$180 for the period Tuesday, July 4 through Sunday July 9. 24 hour security will begin July 6, 2006 after the jog and will end when the CDI is over. Bedding and feed available for purchase on grounds. Note: Stablemates of CDI horses that are entered in the open show may stable in the restricted area providing they meet all the health requirements of the restricted area and have proper identification. A completed stabling form is required for all horses. PERMISSION FOR COMPANION HORSES WILL BE GRANTED ON A CASE BY CASE BASIS AND WILL BE GOVERNED BY STALL AVAILABILITY. During the period of 24 hour security, access will be limited to those wearing a badge: riders, owners, trainers, one groom/ entry and certain show officials. There will be a sign-in/out sheet.

8. VETERINARY INSPECTION: The veterinary inspection (jog) will take place on Thursday, July 6, 2006. Tentatively, in-barn inspections will begin at 1:00pm and the jog will take place at 4:00pm. Details will be posted in the show office.

9. LOCAL TRANSPORTATION ~ ARRANGEMENTS FROM HOTEL TO SHOWGROUNDS: Competitors are responsible for all transportation costs for themselves and their entourage.

10. ADVERTISING AND PUBLICITY ON COMPETITORS AND HORSES (Art. 136.1-2): Competitors may carry the logo of their personal sponsor on the saddle cloth in accordance with Art. 136. 1-2.

11. COMPLAINTS (Art. 168-171) - All complaints to be valid must be made in writing and accompanied by a deposit of 150 CHF or equivalent.

12. PRIZE CLASSIFICATION (Art. 128,129,130) - One fourth of the competitors in each competition shall receive a ribbon and the first place shall receive a trophy. Competitors will be responsible for the declaring and paying of any state, federal and local government taxes applicable. Prize monies will be paid at the conclusion of the show, provided there are no outstanding obligations to the committee, facility, organizers or any supplier and may be picked up in the Horse Show Office.

13. EMT: An Emergency Medical Technician will be on the grounds during show hours. Dial "911" for medical emergencies at all other times. Emergency call numbers will be posted at all telephones on the show grounds and in the Horse Show Office.

14. The State of California asks for current (6 month) health certificate from the state of origin, identification papers on the horse, and Coggins test for those who are staying over three days. The regulations do change periodically. The California State Department of Agriculture at (916) 654-1447 has the most recent information.

VETERINARY ASPECTS "A"

VETERINARY REGULATIONS, 10th Edition, 1st January 2006 (see website www.horsesport.org)

VETERINARY EXAMINATIONS, HORSE INSPECTIONS & PASSPORT CONTROLS These will be carried out in accordance with the "Veterinary Regulations", Art. 1011 & the discipline rules.

"General Regulations", 21st Edition, effective 1st January 2005:

Art. 139.1: Every horse entered for any competition at CNs or CIMs (see Appendix D) in a foreign country (see GRs 141.2), and all horses entered for other CIs, CIOs, Championships, Regional and Olympic Games, whether at home or in foreign countries (see GRs 141.2), must have an official, valid FEI Passport, or a National Passport approved by the FEI and accompanied by an FEI Recognition Card and, when applicable, an FEI registration number, as a means of identification and to establish ownership.

Art. 139.2: Horses taking part in CNs and CIMs (see Appendix D) in their country of residence are not required to have such a passport as is mentioned in paragraph 1. All such horses must be properly registered and identifiable and, unless there is no national requirement for equine influenza vaccination in the host country and in the country of origin all horses must have a valid vaccination certificate.

EQUINE INFLUENZA VACCINATION, VET. REGS. ANNEX VII (except events taking place in NZL & AUS): All horses and ponies for which an FEI Passport, or a National Passport approved by the FEI has been issued, must have the vaccination section endorsed by a veterinarian, stating that it has received two injections for primary vaccination against equine influenza, given between 1 and 3 months apart. In addition, a booster injection must be recorded as having been given within each succeeding 6 months, subsequent to the second injection of the primary vaccination. None of these injections must have been given within the preceding 7 days including the day of the competition or of entry into the competition stables. The above are the minimum requirements for influenza vaccination. Both primary and first and subsequent booster injections should be given according to the manufacturer's instructions which will fall within the stipulation of the FEI ruling.

SAMPLING FOR PROHIBITED SUBSTANCES (Vet. Regs. Chapter V & VI and Annex IV): Regular sampling is carried out in CCI3*/4*, CSIs (3*, 4*, 5*), CIOs, World Cup Qualifiers and Finals, Championships and Games, whereas at other CIs sampling is recommended. When testing takes place, the number of horses tested is at the discretion of the Testing Veterinarian/Veterinary Delegate; however, a minimum of three is recommended (Vet. Regs. Art. 1016)

GENERAL RULES & INFORMATION

Applies to all participants. In the CDI 3*/P, FEI rules take precedence.

CONDITIONS OF ENTRY

1. Every class offered herein which is covered by the rules and specifications of the current USEF Rule Book will be conducted and judged in accordance therewith. USDF rules will apply for quadrille and pas de deux.
2. Management reserves the right to arrange for additional judges and to cancel, combine or amend any class, including but not limited to class awards, scheduling and location.
3. Management reserves the right to refuse, accept conditionally or to cancel any entries, disqualify riders or exhibitors, prohibit exhibition of entries, without claim to damages
4. Show Management reserves the right to interpret all questions and conditions in regard to, or arising out of, or incident to the show, without claims for damages or recourse of any kind. All questions not covered by these rules and regulations shall be decided by the Show Management and such determinations shall be final.
5. Owner/Agent/Participant agrees that every horse entered, or which they bring to the show grounds, will be subject to the rules of the Horse Show management. However, Show Management will, in no case, be responsible for any loss or damage that may occur to any horse entered or on the grounds, and it shall be a condition of entry that each exhibitor agrees to defend, indemnify and hold harmless the U.S. Equestrian , the Federation, the United States Dressage Federation, the California Dressage Society, the FEI and any additional recognizing organizations, the Pebble Beach Equestrian Center, the horse show and its management and employees and volunteers for any loss or accident to his horse, horses or equipment which may occur.
6. All owners and exhibitors will be held responsible for any damage incurred by them, their agents, employees or animals to stall buildings and other properties on the show grounds and shall be billed accordingly. All bills for veterinary, farrier services and feed/bedding are due and payable during the show. The management reserves the right to deduct any unpaid veterinary, farrier and feed bills from premium, stake or prize money, or refunds due the exhibitor. Any exhibitor not meeting obligations to the official veterinarian, farrier or feed supplier will be termed an undesirable exhibitor and entries from that exhibitor may not be accepted at subsequent shows. Unpaid bills will be turned in to the appropriate authorities.
7. Competitors are responsible for all insurance for themselves, employees, owners, horses, equipment, etc. Competitors are personally responsible for damages to third parties caused by themselves, their employees, agents or horses. Competitors are strongly advised to take out third-party insurance providing full coverage for participation in equestrian events at home and abroad and to keep the policy current.
8. Current USEF, FEI, and USDF tests will be used.
9. GR 601-603 of the USEF Rule Book defines the protest procedure.

ENTRIES - SCHEDULING - RIDING TIMES

10. Entries will be accepted on a first-come basis and must include all fees, membership proofs, signatures and payment. *Numbers will not be released until this process is complete.* Entries that are received, complete with payment and signatures will have priority over faxed or emailed entries. Entries received by fax or email are considered to be legal contracts and are subject to all of the rules of the show, including post/late entry fees. Withdrawing at any time will not excuse the responsible party from paying all class, stable and other fees. Those who do not comply with this will be turned in to the recognizing authorities.
11. Management will close the show when it is full and will place excess entries on a wait list. Entries that have arrived after the show is declared full and prior to the printed entry closing date will not be subject to late fees. Any entry postmarked later than the published entry closing date is considered a post entry and all post entry and late fees will apply.
12. Post entries allowed on a space available basis only, prior to the start of the class and after all forms have been completed, signatures obtained and fees paid. Post entry fee of \$10/class applied to all entries. **AFTER CLOSING DATE:** All changes to an existing entry are subject to a \$10 (non-refundable) application fee, payable at the time the change is requested. If the change is granted, the usual class will be charged in addition to the post entry fee. All change requests must be in writing.
13. Copies of all membership cards are required. In order to enter the Adult/Amateur Division, the USEF Membership card **MUST** indicate Amateur and the individual must reach the age of 22 in the current year. If you are not an Adult Amateur member of USEF, you will be entered in Open sections

of the classes. If you are moved to Adult Amateur classes after entry closing, all application, post entry and/or change fees will be applied. The membership requirements of USEF, USDF, and CDS will be strictly followed; the show will collect non-member fees for any individual or horse registration that is required and cannot be proven by presentation of the current card.

14. Classes will be scheduled to accommodate the judges, riders and management. Classes will not necessarily be scheduled in order of difficulty. The 50 minutes between rides rule will be observed. Requests for shorter breaks will be accommodated when logistically possible.

15. **Provisional riding times will be emailed** and posted on www.goldenstatedressage.com and www.ridepebblebeach.com. It is the obligation of the entrant to contact the Show Secretary at 530-265-0950 if times have not been received. Scheduling conflicts must be called to the Show Secretary no later than 48 hours prior to the start of the show. **RIDERS SHOULD BE AWARE THAT IF THE NEED ARISES, THE SHOW MANAGEMENT CAN CHANGE RIDE TIMES AS PER US Equestrian Rule, ARTICLE 309.5. Each exhibitor is responsible to check next days' revised schedule which is posted every evening at the show office.**

16. An Exhibitor's Letter will be included with the riding times. It will give additional information on food, directions and any other particulars of the show. Please read this letter thoroughly.

SHOWGROUNDS- RV PARKING

17. Loose dogs will be impounded and held for ransom. **NO DOGS IN THE SHOW OFFICE!**

18. All classes are planned to be held in the large (20mx60m) arena. **Appropriate tests may be held in the small arena IF there are weather or scheduling problems.**

19. Footing is sand/composition in all competition and warm-up arenas.

20. Bridle numbers must be worn at all times when the horse is out of the stall.

21. Use of the warm-up arenas is limited to those who are entered in the show and, at the discretion of Show Management, will be further restricted to those warming up for the class(es) in progress when there is congestion. **NO ONE ON FOOT WILL BE ALLOWED IN THE WARM-UP AREAS AT ANY TIME.** There will be a designated longe area and longeing may be restricted to pre- and post- competition hours.

22. The main arena will be available for schooling until 5:00pm on Wednesday. After that, the performance court will be closed. Open show arenas will be closed for schooling at 6:00pm on Wednesday. Schooling/warm-up in the main arena may be limited to those who have classes scheduled in that arena.

23. Food will be available on the show grounds.

24. Limited RV's: RV parking is available at \$300 (subject to increase) per RV. There are LIMITED spaces available. All RV's must be self-contained. RV's must park in designated area with a dated permit provided by the show management. Permit must be visibly placed in windshield. Water available. This is not a full service campground; RV spots are solely for the convenience of the competitor. Reservations will be taken on a paid/first come-first served basis. RV's may arrive the same time as horses - after 12 noon on Tuesday, July 4 and they must depart by 12 noon on Monday July 10

25. Motorcycles, ATV's, Golf Carts and Bicycles: Unlicensed drivers are not permitted to operate any motorized vehicles on the show grounds. Failure to abide by these regulations will subject the exhibitor to suspension from the horse show and forfeiture of prizes won. Motorized vehicles are not allowed on the Pebble Beach trails. Bicycles: have become a serious problem and will not be allowed in the area of the show rings and the warm-up rings. Bicycles are not allowed on the Pebble Beach trails.

STABLING - GROUNDS FEE

26. Owner/Agent/Participant agrees that show management is merely providing stabling for the convenience of the participant and management and sponsoring organizations shall have no responsibility whatsoever for any injury, loss, damage, etc., as a result of using said stabling. Owner/Agent/Participant agrees to indemnify, defend, and hold Show Management, their officials, officers, directors, employees, agents, personnel, volunteers and affiliated organizations harmless from any loss, damage or claims as a result of said use. **Owner/Agent/Participant assumes all care, custody, and control with regard to this use.**

27. The Stabling Request Form MUST be completed and submitted with entry. Stabling is permanent box stalls and all stabling has doors. Stabling will be assigned in order of receipt of entry, with consideration for requests made on the entry. The charge is **\$160 for all stalls outside the CDI 3* stabling area. All horses stabled inside the CDI stabling must pay \$180 per stall, whether or not the horse is entered in the CDI***. First bedding of five bales included.** These fees apply whether the stall is used for an animal, tack or grooming. There is no single day fee for stabling.

28. Stabling is available from noon, two days prior to the start of show through Sunday. Exhibitors

are responsible for the condition of the stalls upon departure. Anyone dismantling stalls or causing damage to a stall will be charged a \$100 fee per panel, with a maximum fine per stall of \$400. Stalls are wood or canvas 10x10 with top and bottom doors and roofs.

29. Permission may be granted for open show horses to be stabled in CDI 3* stabling IF proof of current vaccinations AND photo identity are presented. Please review the Veterinary information under the CDI Rules. PERMISSION WILL BE GRANTED ON A CASE BY CASE BASIS. Companion horses will be subject to the in-stall inspection schedule.

30. Grounds Fee of \$30 per horse per day will be charged for all horses not stabled. All releases must be signed. This includes any horse brought onto the grounds, even if the horse remains on the horse trailer or is ridden onto the show grounds. See also, Rule No. 35.

31. An initial feed and bedding order may be submitted with the entry and a signed open check or VISA must be submitted to cover this and future orders. During the show, feed and bedding may be purchased at the show office. All feed orders received in the show office by NOON will be delivered the same day. On Saturday, no orders will be accepted after NOON. There will be no deliveries on Sunday. All feed orders must state barn and stall numbers, except for the one submitted with entry. Feed and bedding will not be delivered without a signed open check. No straw is allowed.

32. **NO NAILS IN STALLS!!!** Cost of repair for any damage or defacement of Pebble Beach Equestrian Center property will be charged to the exhibitor. Exhibitor is responsible to inspect stall and report pre-existing damage prior to using stall.

33. Please deposit all manure at the end of the barn aisles. Waste materials must be disposed of properly, in accordance with California State Law and the rules of U.S.Equestrian.

FEES - REFUNDS

34. Class fees are published with class listings. Office fee of \$35 for each entry. CDFR/USEF/CDS Travel Grant/Office fees are collected once for horses entered in both shows (subject to change),

35. \$100 fee for non-competing horses. Each non-competing horse must have a signed release, wear an assigned number, must observe the rules governing the use of the warm-up areas and must pay any required fees, including stabling and grounds fees. In the event of oversubscription, show management reserves the right to refuse to allow non-competing horses to be on the grounds. Non-competing horses may use the warm-up arenas only when there is no congestion. Any horse brought onto the grounds, including the parking lots, is subject to the rules of the show. This includes horses that never leave a horse trailer. Violation of this rule will result in double the fees due.

36. Any balance due at the end of the show will be billed with a billing charge of \$50. Payment must be immediately upon receipt of the bill. Non-payment will result in the individual being turned in to the sponsoring organizations, in addition to all legal ramifications.

37. **REFUNDS.** ALL REQUESTS MUST BE IN WRITING, signed by the exhibitor. For cancellations made prior to stated entry closing date, refunds will be made in full, less a \$75 processing fee. After the entry closing date, refunds will be made for classes that are filled from the wait list and for unused stabling and only if the following conditions are met: 1) a veterinarian's certificate or rider's medical excuse must be submitted; 2) notification must be in writing to the Show Office PRIOR to the show day(s) in question; 3) it must be proven that the stabling was not used. A processing fee of \$20 per class and \$50 per stall will be deducted from the refund. A wait list will be maintained in order of date and time of scratch. Refunds will be applied to the list starting with the earliest valid scratch.

38. Checks returned by the bank will be assessed \$25 upon the first return and will not be run through a second time. A cashier's check or cash will be needed to clear the entry.

39. In the event that all or part of the competition is cancelled due to a storm, accident or other emergency, the competition will not be responsible for refunding entry, stabling, office or any similar fees for the cancelled class or classes. If classes are rescheduled, competitors MUST stay in contact with the Show Office to be apprised of the new ride times.

40. Checks payable to Pebble Beach Equestrian.

AWARDS - PRIZE MONEY - FREESTYLES - MISCELLANEOUS

41. Award ceremony procedures will be posted in the show office. The CDI 3* requires that riders appear formally attired and mounted for all award ceremonies.

42. Prize money will be paid when it has been determined that all financial obligations have been satisfied. Please refer to the payout charts on page 7 for the amount to be paid. 43. Show management reserves the right to amend award information by making notification in subsequent advertising, exhibitor letters, show programs or other communication.

44. It is the exhibitor's responsibility to have the cued tape or CD at the announcer's stand at the start of the ride and a representative at the stand to tell the announcer when to start and stop the tape. Sound checks will be conducted at each show; please make arrangements with the an-

nouncer. Exhibitors are responsible for retrieving their own tapes/CDs.

45. Except for USEF/USDF Championship classes and for FEI Pony Riders, FEI Junior and Young Rider Freestyles, in order to enter a freestyle class at any level, a horse/rider combination must have received a minimum score of 58% in the highest test of the declared freestyle level or any test of a higher level at a USEF Recognized Competition. A photocopy of the test verifying eligibility must be submitted with the entry for a freestyle class.

46. Scored tests will be given only to riders or their agents and only after the results are finalized and the class is placed. Any disputes concerning scores, divisions entered (AA, JR, YR,), USDF Q) and/or placings must be brought to the attention of the Show Office within one hour of the end of the show day. Scores and placings become final at that time.

JUNIORS

47. All minors/juniors must be supervised by their parent/guardian or authorized agent at all times while at or on the show grounds, whether riding or on foot. The parent/guardian or authorized agent assumes all responsibility to protect juniors from any injury, damage, harm and/or loss and shall indemnify, defend & hold Show Management, its employees and volunteers, Pebble Beach Equestrian Center, the Pebble Beach Company and all affiliated organizations harmless therefrom.

48. (a): Minors who do not have a valid driver's license which allows them to operate a motorized vehicle in the state in which they reside will not be permitted to operate a motorized vehicle of any kind including, but not limited to, golf carts, motorcycles, scooters, or farm utility vehicles on the competition grounds of recognized competitions. Minors who have a valid temporary license may operate the above described motorized vehicles as long as they are accompanied by an adult with a valid driver's license. Violations of this rule will be cause for sanctions against the parent(s), guardian(s) and/or trainer(s) who are responsible for the child committing the offense. Penalties may include exclusion of the child, parent(s), guardian(s), and/or trainer(s) from the competition grounds for the remainder of the competition and charges being filed against any of the above individuals in accordance with Rule 6. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule. (USEF GR 301.5)

STATE BORDER CROSSINGS

The most recent information available on documents necessary for transporting horses across state lines is available at the following numbers: Nevada Department of Agriculture - (775) 688-1180 and California Department of Agriculture - (916) 654-1447. Be sure to ask if there are any prohibitions against feed as well.

USEF MEMBERSHIP STATEMENT

Life, senior active, and junior active members shall be eligible to participate in all classes at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions at the Preliminary Level or above and Combined Driving Competitions at the advanced level, Dressage, Reining, and Vaulting Competitions and Endurance Rides provided the respective breed/discipline dues or breed/discipline category fee has been paid. A non-member may participate as a handler, rider, driver, owner, lessee, agent, coach or trainer at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions, Dressage Competitions, Reining Competitions, and Combined Driving Competitions upon payment of a \$20 nonmember registration fee and a \$5 breed/discipline category fee for each breed/discipline. Participants in the following classes are exempted from the requirements of this rule; 1) leadline; 2) exhibitions; 3) games and races; 4) classes for 4-H members; 5) walk/trot and academy classes (Academy classes are classes limited to horses used regularly in a lesson program); 6) USDF introductory level tests, pas de deux and quadrille classes; 7) NRHA endorsed Reining Competitions. Also exempted from this requirement are citizens of other nations who have proof, in English, of current membership in good standing of their own National Federation; 8) USEA beginner novice division; and 9) assistant handlers in Dressage Sport Horse Breeding classes. (See GR807.4 of the Federation rules.)
