Stakes Class:

\$10 added to the designated prize money for classes marked ST. Stakes money will be awarded when there are five or more individuals entered in the class; the add back will be refunded if the minimum entry is not met and stakes money will not be awarded. If class is split for ribbons and trophies, the stakes money will be awarded to the combined entry (before the split) and the following percentages will prevail: 1st-40%, 2nd-25%, 3rd-20%, 4th-10%, 5th-5%.

Adult Amateur - Competitors may compete as adults from the beginning of the calendar year in which they reach the age of 22 and must hold a USEF Amateur card in order to qualify for this award.

Junior/YR - Individuals are eligible as Juniors from the beginning of the calendar year in which they reach the age of 14 until the end of the calendar year in which they reach the age of 18. Individuals are eligible as Young Riders from the beginning of the calendar year in which they reach the age of 16 until they end of the calendar year in which they reach the age of 21.

GENERAL RULES & INFORMATION

Applies to all participants.

CONDITIONS OF ENTRY

1. *Every class offered herein which is covered by the rules and specifications of the current USEF Rule Book will be conducted and judged in accordance therewith. USDF rules will apply for quadrille and pas de deux.*
2. Management reserves the right to arrange for additional judges and to cancel, combine or amend any class, including but not limited to class awards, scheduling and location.
3. Management reserves the right to refuse, accept conditionally or to cancel any entries, disqualify riders or exhibitors, prohibit exhibition of entries, without claim to damages
4. Show Management reserves the right to interpret all questions and conditions in regard to, or arising out of, or incident to the show, without claims for damages or recourse of any kind. All questions not covered by these rules and regulations shall be decided by the Show Management and such determinations shall be final.
5. Owner/Agent/Participant agrees that every horse entered, or which they bring to the show grounds, will be subject to the rules of the Horse Show management. However, Show Management will, in no case, be responsible for any loss or damage that may occur to any horse entered or on the grounds, and it shall be a condition of entry that each exhibitor agrees to defend, indemnify and hold harmless the U.S. Equestrian, the Federation, the United States Dressage Federation, the California Dressage Society, the FEI and any additional recognizing organizations, the facility at which the event is held, the horse show and its management and employees and volunteers for any loss or accident to his horse, horses or equipment which may occur.
6. All owners and exhibitors will be held responsible for any damage incurred by them, their agents, employees or animals to stall buildings and other properties on the show grounds and shall be billed accordingly. All bills for veterinary, farrier services and feed/bedding are due and payable during the show. The management reserves the right to deduct any unpaid veterinary, farrier and feed bills from premium, stake or prize money, or refunds due the exhibitor. Any exhibitor not meeting obligations to the official veterinarian, farrier or feed supplier will be termed an undesirable exhibitor and entries from that exhibitor may not be accepted at subsequent shows. Unpaid bills will be turned in to the appropriate authorities.
7. Competitors are responsible for all insurance for themselves, employees, owners, horses, equipment, etc. Competitors are personally responsible for damages to third parties caused by themselves, their employees, agents or horses. Competitors are strongly advised to take out third-party insurance providing full coverage for participation in equestrian events at home and abroad and to keep the policy current.
8. Current USEF, FEI, and USDF tests will be used.
9. GR 601-603 of the USEF Rule Book defines the protest procedure.

ENTRIES - SCHEDULING - RIDING TIMES

10. Entries will be accepted on a first-come basis and must include all fees, membership proofs, signatures and payment. *Numbers will not be released until this process is complete.* Entries that are received, complete with payment and signatures will have priority over faxed or emailed entries. However, entries received by fax or email are considered to be legal contracts and are subject to all of the rules of the show, including post/late entry fees. Once the entry is accepted, withdrawing at any time will not excuse the responsible party from paying all class, stable and other fees. Those who do not comply with this will be turned in to the recognizing authorities.
11. Management will close the show when it is full and will place excess entries on a wait list. Entries that have arrived after the show is declared full and prior to the printed entry closing date will not be subject to late fees. Any entry postmarked later than the published entry closing date is considered a post entry and all post entry and late fees will apply.
12. Post entries allowed on a space available basis only, prior to the start of the class and after all forms have been completed, signatures obtained and fees paid. Post entry fee of \$10/class applied to all entries. **AFTER CLOSING DATE:** All changes to an existing entry are subject to a \$10 application fee, payable at the time the change is requested. If the change is granted, the usual class fee will be charged in addition to the post entry fee. All change requests must be in writing and accompanied by payment.
13. Copies of all membership cards are required. In order to enter the Adult/Amateur Division, the USEF Membership card **MUST** indicate Amateur and the individual must reach the age of 22 in the current year. If you are not an Adult Amateur member of USEF, you will be entered in Open sections of the classes. If you are moved to Adult Amateur classes after entry closing, all application, post entry and/or change fees will be applied. The membership requirements of USEF, USDF, and CDS will be strictly followed; the show will collect non-member fees for any individual or horse registration that is required and cannot be proven by presentation of the current card.
14. Classes will be scheduled to accommodate the judges, riders and management. Classes will not necessarily be scheduled in order of difficulty. The 50 minutes between rides rule will be observed. Requests for shorter breaks will be

accommodated when logistically possible.

15. **Provisional times will be emailed** and posted on www.goldenstatedressage.com. It is the entrant's obligation to contact davenport@saber.net if times have not been received. Scheduling conflicts must be called to the Show Secretary no later than 48 hours prior to the start of the show. **RIDERS SHOULD BE AWARE THAT IF THE NEED ARISES, THE SHOW MANAGEMENT CAN CHANGE RIDE TIMES AS PER USEF ARTICLE 309.5. Each exhibitor is responsible to check next days' revised schedule which is posted every evening at the show office.**

16. Exhibitor's Letter will give additional information on food, directions and any other particulars of the show. Please read this letter thoroughly.

SHOWGROUNDS- RV PARKING

17. Loose dogs will be impounded and held for ransom. **NO DOGS IN THE SHOW OFFICE!**

18. All classes are planned to be held in the large (20mx60m) arena. **Appropriate tests may be held in the small arena IF there are weather or scheduling problems.**

19. Footing is sand in all competition and warm-up arenas.

20. A bridle number must be worn at all times when the horse is out of the stall.

21. Use of the warm-up arenas is limited to those who are entered in the show and, at the discretion of Show Management, will be further restricted to those warming up for the class(es) in progress when there is congestion. ***NO ONE ON FOOT WILL BE ALLOWED IN THE WARM-UP AREAS AT ANY TIME.*** There will be a designated longe area and longeing may be restricted to pre- and post- competition hours.

22. The main arena will be available for schooling until 5:00pm on Wednesday. After that, the performance court will be closed. Open show arenas will be closed for schooling at 6:00pm on Wednesday. Schooling/warm-up in the main arena may be limited to those who have classes scheduled in that arena.

23. Food will be available on the show grounds.

24. Limited RV's: RV parking is available at \$200 per RV. There are LIMITED spaces available. All RV's must be self-contained. RV's must park in designated area with a dated permit provided by the show management. Permit must be visibly placed in windshield. Water available. This is not a full service campground; RV spots are solely for the convenience of the competitor. Reservations will be taken on a paid/first come-first served basis. RV's may arrive the same time as horses - after 12 noon on Tuesday, June 30 and they must depart by 12 noon on Monday July 6.

25. Motorcycles, ATV's, Golf Carts and Bicycles: Unlicensed drivers are not permitted to operate any motorized vehicles on the show grounds. Failure to abide by these regulations will subject the exhibitor to suspension from the horse show and forfeiture of prizes won. Motorized vehicles are not allowed on the Pebble Beach trails. Bicycles have become a serious problem and will not be allowed in the area of the show rings and the warm-up rings. Bicycles are not allowed on the Pebble Beach trails.

STABLING - GROUNDS FEE

26. Owner/Agent/Participant agrees that show management is merely providing stabling for the convenience of the participant and management and sponsoring organizations shall have no responsibility whatsoever for any injury, loss, damage, etc., as a result of using said stabling. Owner/Agent/Participant agrees to indemnify, defend, and hold Show Management, their officials, officers, directors, employees, agents, personnel, volunteers and affiliated organizations harmless from any loss, damage or claims as a result of said use. **Owner/Agent/Participant assumes all care, custody, and control with regard to this use.**

27. The Stabling Request MUST be completed. Stabling will be assigned in order of receipt of entry, with consideration for requests made on the entry. The charge is \$175 for all stalls. ***First bedding included.*** These fees apply whether the stall is used for an animal, tack or grooming. There is no single day fee for stabling.

28. Stabling is available from noon, two days prior to the start of show through Sunday. Exhibitors are responsible for the condition of the stalls upon departure. Anyone dismantling stalls or causing damage to a stall will be charged a \$100 fee per panel, with a maximum fine per stall of \$400. Stalls are wood or canvas 10x10 with top and bottom doors and roofs.

29. Grounds Fee of \$35 per horse per day charged for all horses not stabled. All releases must be signed. This includes any horse brought onto the grounds, even if the horse remains on the horse trailer or is ridden onto the show grounds. See also, Rule No. 34.

30. An initial feed and bedding order may be submitted with the entry and a signed open check must be submitted to cover this and future orders. During the show, feed and bedding may be purchased at the show office. All feed orders received in the show office by NOON will be delivered the same day. On Saturday, no orders will be accepted after NOON. There will be no deliveries on Sunday. All feed orders must state barn and stall numbers, except for the one submitted with entry. *Feed and bedding will not be delivered without a signed open check.* No straw is allowed.

31. **NO NAILS IN STALLS!!!** Cost of repair for any damage or defacement of Pebble Beach Equestrian Center property will be charged to the exhibitor. Exhibitor is responsible to inspect stall and report pre-existing damage prior to using stall.

32. Please deposit all manure at the end of the barn aisles. Waste materials must be disposed of properly, in

accordance with California State Law and the rules of U.S.Equestrian.

FEES - REFUNDS

33. Class fees are published with class listings. Office fee of \$35 for each entry.

34. No fee for non-competing horses but each non-competing horse must have a stall, and an official entry must be completed with all releases signed and the following fees paid: Stall (\$175), Office (\$35). The horse must wear the assigned number, and must observe the rules governing the use of the warm-up areas. In the event of oversubscription, show management reserves the right to refuse to allow non-competing horses to be on the grounds. Non-competing horses may use the warm-up arenas only when there is no congestion. Any horse brought onto the grounds, including the parking lots, is subject to the rules of the show. Violation of this rule will result in double the fees due.

35. Any balance due at the end of the show will be billed with a billing charge of \$25. Payment must be immediately upon receipt of the bill. Non-payment will result in the individual being turned in to the sponsoring organizations, in addition to all legal ramifications.

36. **REFUNDS.** ALL REQUESTS MUST BE IN WRITING, signed by the exhibitor. For cancellations made **prior to stated entry closing date**, refunds will be made in full, less a \$75 processing fee. **After the entry closing date**, refunds will be made for classes that are filled from the wait list if the following conditions are met: 1) a veterinarian's certificate or rider's medical excuse must be submitted; 2) notification must be in writing to the Show Office PRIOR to the show day(s) in question. Stabling will not be refunded after entry closing. A processing fee of \$20 per class and \$50 per stall will be deducted from any refund. A wait list will be maintained in order of date and time of scratch. Refunds will be applied to the list starting with the earliest valid scratch.

**NO REFUNDS OF ANY KIND FOR DAY OF SHOW SCRATCHES, INCLUDING
BUT NOT LIMITED TO HAUL-IN, DRUG, CLASS, OFFICE AND ASSOCIATION FEES. FEES FOR SCRATCHED
CLASSES WILL NOT AUTOMATICALLY BE APPLIED TO A REQUESTED CLASS. ALL SCRATCHES SUBJECT
TO REFUND POLICIES OF THE SHOW.**

37. Checks returned by the bank will be assessed \$25 upon the first return and will not be run through a second time. A cashier's check or cash will be needed to clear the entry.

38. In the event that all or part of the competition is cancelled due to a storm, accident or other emergency, the competition will not be responsible for refunding entry, stabling, office or any similar fees for the cancelled class or classes. If classes are rescheduled, competitors MUST stay in contact with the Show Office to be appraised of the new ride times.

39. Checks payable to Pebble Beach Equestrian, Inc.

AWARDS - PRIZE MONEY - FREESTYLES - MISCELLANEOUS

40. Prize money will be paid when it has been determined that all financial obligations have been satisfied. Please refer to the payout charts for the amount to be paid.

41. Show management reserves the right to amend award information by making notification in subsequent advertising, exhibitor letters, show programs or other communication.

42. It is exhibitor's responsibility to have the cued tape or CD at announcer's stand at the start of the ride and a representative at the stand to tell the announcer when to start and stop the tape. Sound checks will be conducted at each show; make arrangements with the announcer. Exhibitors are responsible for retrieving their own tapes/CDs.

43. Except for USEF/USDF Championship classes and for FEI Pony Riders, FEI Junior and Young Rider Freestyles, in order to enter a freestyle class at any level, a horse/rider combination must have received a minimum score of 60% in the highest test of the declared freestyle level or any test of a higher level at a USEF Recognized Competition, prior to the show being entered. A photocopy of the test verifying eligibility must be submitted with the entry for a freestyle class.

44. Scored tests will be given only to riders or their agents and only after the results are finalized and the class is placed. Any disputes concerning scores, divisions entered (AA, JR, YR), USDF Q) and/or placings must be brought to the attention of the Show Office within one hour of the end of the show day. Scores and placings become final at that time.

JUNIORS

45. All minors/juniors must be supervised by their parent/guardian or authorized agent at all times while at or on the show grounds, whether riding or on foot. The parent/guardian or authorized agent assumes all responsibility to protect juniors from any injury, damage, harm and/or loss and shall indemnify, defend & hold Show Management, its employees and volunteers, the facility at which the event is held, the Pebble Beach Company and all affiliated organizations harmless therefrom.

46. (a): Minors who do not have a valid driver's license which allows them to operate a motorized vehicle in the state in which they reside will not be permitted to operate a motorized vehicle of any kind including, but not limited to, golf carts, motorcycles, scooters, or farm utility vehicles on the competition grounds of recognized competitions. Minors who have a valid temporary license may operate the above described motorized vehicles as long as they are accompanied by an

adult with a valid driver's license. Violations of this rule will be cause for sanctions against the parent(s), guardian(s) and/or trainer(s) who are responsible for the child committing the offense. Penalties may include exclusion of the child, parent(s), guardian(s), and/or trainer(s) from the competition grounds for the remainder of the competition and charges being filed against any of the above individuals in accordance with Rule 6. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule. (USEF GR 301.5)

47. Protective headgear is required of Juniors, except as stipulated in specific dressage classes.

ALL COMPETITORS

48. Except as may be otherwise mandated by local law, the Federation, Pebble Beach Equestrian, and Golden State Dressage, Inc. strongly encourage all riders, while riding anywhere on the competition grounds, to wear protective headgear with harness secured which passes or surpasses ASTM (American Society for Testing and Materials)/SEI (Safety Equipment Institute) standards for equestrian use and carries the SEI tag. It is the responsibility of the rider, or the parent or guardian or trainer of the junior exhibitor to see to it that the headgear worn complies with appropriate safety standards for protective headgear intended for equestrian use, and is properly fitted and in good condition, and the Federation, Show Committee and Licensed Officials are not responsible for checking headgear worn for such compliance.

49. The Federation, Pebble Beach Equestrian and Golden State Dressage make no representation or warranty, express or implied, about any protective headgear, and caution riders that death or serious injury may result despite wearing such headgear as all equestrian sports involve inherent dangerous risk and as no helmet can protect against all foreseeable injuries.

STATE BORDER CROSSINGS

The most recent information available on documents necessary for transporting horses across state lines is available at the following numbers: Nevada Department of Agriculture - (775) 688-1180 and California Department of Agriculture - (916) 654-1447. Be sure to ask if there are any prohibitions against feed as well.

UNITED STATES EQUESTRIAN FEDERATION: GR901.9 USEF MEMBERSHIP STATEMENT: Life, senior active and junior active members shall be eligible to participate in all classes at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions at the Preliminary Level or above and Combined Driving Competitions at the Advanced Level, Dressage, Reining and Vaulting Competitions and Endurance Rides. A nonmember may participate as a handler, rider, driver, owner, lessee, agent, coach or trainer at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions, Dressage Competitions, Reining Competitions and Combined Driving Competitions upon payment of a \$30 nonmember registration fee. Participants in the following classes are exempted from the Requirements of this rule: 1) leadline; 2) exhibitions; 3) games and races; 4) classes for 4-H members; 5) walk trot and academy classes (academy classes are classes limited to horses used regularly in a lesson program); 6) USDF introductory level tests, pas de deux and quadrille classes; 7) NRHA Endorsed Reining Competitions. 8) Opportunity classes, 9) citizens of other nations who have proof, in English, of current membership in good standing of their own National Federation, 10) USEA beginner novice division; and 11) assistant handlers in Dressage Sport Horse Breeding classes. *EC 7/21/08 Effective 12/1/08*

REMINDER

Competitors are responsible for all insurance for themselves, employees, owners, horses, etc. Competitors are personally responsible for damages to third parties caused by themselves, their employees, agents or horses. They are strongly advised to take out third-party insurance providing full coverage for participation in equestrian events at home and abroad and to keep the policy current.

REMINDER

Complete reading, understanding of and compliance with all of the rules of the show and the sponsoring organizations is the responsibility of the exhibitor. Questions are welcomed; show officials will attempt to explain any rule or policy.

REMINDER

Signing the Entry Release gives up important rights - read the Release!

ATTENTION COMPETITORS: Don't Wait in Line

Each competitor is responsible for supplying management with correct association numbers (USDF, USEF, CDS, FEI) for horse owner, rider, trainer and coach (if applicable) before the day(s) of the competition.

The scores of competitors who fail to supply correct numbers may not be counted toward national awards. Competitors are strongly urged to submit copies of their memberships and horse registrations with the entry.

Entries that are complete in every respect will be placed in the Express Line.

USDF Membership Benefits: USDF is dedicated to education, recognition of achievement, and promotion of dressage. For details on member benefits, including educational programs, awards, and other opportunities, refer to the USDF Directory or the USDF Web site at www.usdf.org.



Membership Requirements for USDF-recognized Competitions: Owners and riders, including foreign riders and owners who are not residents of the US, wishing to participate in a USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competitions as a rider or owner/lessee, must have either a USDF Group Membership (GM), Intercollegiate/Interscholastic Membership (IM), Participating Membership (PM), or have a USDF Non-Member (NM) identification number and pay the USDF NM fee. (Note: USDF Business Members can own horses but cannot compete as riders with their business membership.)

Horses competing at USDF-recognized/USEF-licensed shows must have either a USDF Horse Identification (HID) number or a USDF Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR). Proper credentials or verification certificates must be presented to the competition secretary.

Riders and owners wishing to participate in a USDF recognized competition, and not able to present either a USDF membership or NM identification card or verification certificate, or a USDF LHR or USDF HID card or verification certificate to the competition secretary, must complete a USDF Affidavit form, and pay the \$5 affidavit filing fee. A copy of a completed affidavit form from another competition may also be used for verification purposes for up to 60 days. (Exception: Affidavits cannot be used at Regional Championships.)

Exceptions:

- Horses competing only in Individual Breed Classes (IBC) at DSHB competitions, horses competing only in breed restricted dressage or DSHB classes at Regular Competitions (e.g. all Arabian, all Friesian, or all Morgan classes), or in USDF Introductory Level tests, Pas de Deux, Quadrille, or FEI ParaEquestrian classes, are exempt from this requirement. Also exempt are horses ridden in leadline, exhibitions, games and races, classes for 4-H members, walk-trot and academy classes. For foreign-owned horses competing in a CDI, USDF accepts copies of the horse identification pages from an FEI passport in lieu of a USDF HID or Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR) number.
- Riders and owners/lessees competing only in classes which are exempt from the USDF HID requirements are also exempt from the USDF Non-Member (NM) identification number and NM fee requirements. Also exempt are Handlers of horses competing in DSHB In-Hand or Group classes.

Memberships Defined

Participating Membership (PM): A membership issued to an individual directly by USDF. The membership year is December 1 through November 30. PMs are available for 1-year (\$62), 5-years (\$250), or life (\$1,000). A Youth Participating Membership (YPM) is available for members under 21 (as of December 1 of the current membership year) for \$35. A PM allows the member to compete at USDF-recognized/USEF-licensed competitions and to participate as a rider and/or owner for all Adequan®/USDF Year-End Awards, Great American Insurance Group/USDF Breeders' Championship Series Finals, and the Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional Dressage Championship program.

Group Membership (GM): A membership issued to an individual by USDF when the member name and dues are submitted to USDF through an affiliate Group Member Organization (GMO). The GM year begins December 1 and ends November 30. A GM allows the member to compete at USDF-recognized/USEF-licensed competitions and participate in the USDF Rider Awards program.

Intercollegiate/Interscholastic Membership (IM): A membership issued to an individual by USDF when the member name and dues are submitted to USDF through an affiliate Intercollegiate/Interscholastic Member Organization (IMO). The membership year is December 1 through November 30. An IM allows the member to compete at USDF-recognized/USEF-licensed competitions, and participate in the USDF Rider Awards program.

Business Membership (BM): A membership that runs December 1 through November 30 and is issued to a business or organization directly by USDF. The USDF Business Membership (\$175) offers a wider variety of advertising benefits. Business Memberships satisfy requirements of horse ownership only.

Non-Member (NM) Identification Number: Effective 10/1/2007: For each USDF non-member owner/lessee and USDF non-member rider there will be a USDF non-member fee of \$20 per competition that must be collected by the show secretary and submitted to USDF in addition to the \$5 affidavit fee if the person cannot provide a copy of their USDF NM card. For persons applying for the first time for a non-member number the \$5 affidavit fee is not required. Owners/lessees or riders exempt from the non-member number requirements are also exempt from paying the USDF non-member fee. An individual with a USDF NM identification number is not eligible for any USDF membership benefits. Once a USDF NM number has been assigned, a USDF NM card can be obtained from the USDF Web site.

Horse Identification (HID) Number: A one-time tracking number for horses (\$20). Scores earned by a horse with an HID will be recorded, but will NOT be counted towards Adequan®/USDF Year-End Awards. A horse with an HID is not eligible to compete in Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional qualifying or championship classes or Great American Insurance Group/USDF Breeders' Championship Series Finals. An HID can be upgraded to a Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR) for a fee of \$65. If a horse has a USDF LHR it does not need an HID. An HID does not need to be renewed.

Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR): A horse with a LHR (\$85) is eligible for Adequan®/USDF Year-End Awards, and eligible to compete at Great American Insurance Group/USDF Breeders' Championship Series Finals and Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional qualifying and championship classes, assuming requirements for the owner and rider are met. If a horse has a LHR it does not need an HID. A LHR does not need to be renewed.

Applications for Participating Membership (PM), Business Membership (BM), Non-Member (NM) identification number, Horse Identification (HID) number, and Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR) may be found in the following locations:

- On the USDF Web site: www.usdf.org. You can submit the application online, print, fax or mail it.
- In the show office at USDF-recognized/USEF-licensed competitions classified by USEF as Dressage Competitions, and Regular Competitions which are open to all breeds.

The effective date of membership is the date the form and correct fees are received in the USDF office or, if applying at a competition, the date received by the competition secretary.

2008 Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional Dressage Championships

In 2008, a single Regional Dressage Championship program organized by the United States Dressage Federation (USDF), and recognized by the United States Equestrian Federation, Inc. (USEF), will be held in each of the nine USDF regions. In addition, Alaska and Hawaii may each hold state championships if an official request from a GMO is received by April 1 of the prior year.

The 2008 Regional Championship Program Rules can be found on the USDF Web site, www.usdf.org, at the Regional Championships page, or refer to the 2008 USDF Directory for the comprehensive list of rules and requirements for this program.

Membership/Registration Requirements for Qualifying & Championships:

Rider:

- Must be a USDF Participating* Member (PM) at the time qualifying scores are earned and at the time of the championships.
- Must be a USEF member (Junior Active, Senior Active, or Life) at the time the qualifying scores are earned and at the time of the championships.

Horse:

- Must be USDF Lifetime Registered (LTR) at the time qualifying scores are earned and at the time of the championships. Horse registration must be in the name(s) of the current owner(s) or lessee(s) of record. If a current lease recording is on file with USDF, the lessee is recognized as "owner" for all USDF membership requirements.
- Must be USEF (Annual or Lifetime) recorded at the time qualifying scores are earned and at the time of the championships. Horse recording must be in the name(s) of the current owner(s) or lessee(s) of record. A horse is not required to have registry papers.

Owner:

- Must be a USDF member (PM* or Business Member (BM)) at the time the qualifying scores are earned and at the time of the championships.
- Must be a USEF member (Junior Active, Senior Active, or Life) at the time qualifying scores are earned and at the time of the championships.

*PMs are USDF members who join USDF directly. USDF Group Members (GM) are ineligible.

2008 Minimum Qualifying Scores

One set of nationally-standardized qualifying scores has been established for all USEF/USDF Regional Championships, for levels through Intermediate I, in three divisions: open, adult amateur, and junior/young rider. FEI Junior and FEI Young Rider classes have only one respective division. Intermediate II, Grand Prix, and freestyles have only open divisions. The minimum percentages are as follows:

USDF Statement on Animal Welfare

The United States Dressage Federation, Inc. (USDF), a federation of over 125 independent organizations throughout the United States with a membership in excess of 33,000 members, supports the concept of ethical treatment of animals.

Dressage is a classical method of training horses, based upon the horse's natural responses, as carried out in a gradual, planned program during which the horse's athletic abilities are improved in a systematic manner. As a result, the horse becomes capable, comfortable, and responsive in partnership with the rider without the use of force. Dressage competition at various levels of achievement is the ultimate test of the training program to determine whether the desired harmony between horse and rider has been achieved.

The rules pertaining to dressage competition prohibit the use of artificial appliances, training aids, and drugs, which would force the horse to submit. Instead, the emphasis is upon training and a cooperative partnership with the rider. Major competitions are carefully monitored to assure that there is no unnecessary force or harshness displayed.

Unlike other horse sports in which horses enter training at a relatively immature state, dressage training is usually not seriously begun until the horse is three or four. The top levels of achievement require five or more years of progressive training and it is not unusual to see horses in international competition in their late teens. This, in itself, places a premium on good care and soundness throughout the horse's life.

While supporting the concept of animal welfare in its broadest form, the United States Dressage Federation, Inc., also recognizes that it is unrealistic to ascribe human emotions and responses to the horse which in its wild state is a creature of flight, living a hard and precarious existence. Under domestication, the horse is assured of ample food, water, and shelter, as well as protection against infectious diseases and damaging parasites, thus leading a longer and healthier life with a high rate of survival.

As an educational organization, USDF has numerous programs, which teach people how to pursue the accepted, humane training methods. A program of certifying instructors also emphasizes protecting the horse's welfare in pursuit of dressage training.
